Anti-communist tarps, posters taken down in Cavite

The Philippine National Police in Cavite took responsibility for the anti-communist tarps and posters displayed in some areas in the province, which Gov. Jervie Remulla ordered taken down a day after his heated exchange with a military official.

Remulla ordered last Oct. 27 the posters hung at Basnet City police station removed, while his office continued to receive reports of the same propaganda material seen in Silang, Maragondon and Ternate towns.

In a series of tweets last Oct. 27, Remulla said the rift between him and Lt. Gen. Antonio Parlate

Jr., head of the military's Southern Luzon Command, had been settled with a phone call from the Army officer.

The governor, however, maintained his position on the military's Red-tagging. "Cavite is an insurgency-free prov-

ince so no need for unnecessary propaganda. Focus should be

on pandemic efforts, economic recovery, education, connectivity, etc.," he said.

Parlate is also spokesperson for the National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict, which drew criticisms for branding outspoken celebrities

as leftist supporters or communist sympathizers.

Col. Matron Santos, Cavite police director, said the tarps and posters bearing the logos of the Communist Party of the Philippines, New People's Army and National Democrat-

ic Front of the Philippines (CPP-NPA-NDFP) and labeled "Haring Terrorista/Dakilang Marikina/King of Terrorist/ Great Fraud") were the initiatives of local police stations.

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Batangas, Cavite top latest count of new COVID-19 cases; less than 6 per cent of active cases are critical, severe

The country's COVID-19 cases crossed the 579,000 mark after 2,906 new infections were reported by the Department of Health (DOH) last Oct. 30.

The Philippines already logged 228,933 COVID-19 cases, 10 months after the first in-

fection was announced in the country.

In its latest case update, the DOH said that 10.8 percent of the total figure are active cases or 41,291 people are currently ill, of which, 81.3 percent are exhibiting mild symptoms, 11.1 are asymptomatic, 3.6 percent



are in critical condition, and 2.9 percent are severe.

According to the

DOH, the areas with the highest number of new cases detected last Oct. 30 were Batangas with 124, Cavite with 121, Quezon City 105, Rizal with 88, and Bulacan with 81.

There were 38 new fatalities reported, bringing the country's death toll to 7,183.

Meanwhile, 606 more patients have recovered from the illness, raising the total to 230,457.

Of the new deaths, 15 occurred this month, 11 in September, seven in August, and the first others happened in May to July.

Humans are born with brains 'prewired' to see words

Humans are born with a part of the brain that is prewired to be receptive to seeing words and letters, setting the stage at birth for people to learn how to read, a new study suggests.

Analyzing brain scans of newborns, researchers found that this part of the brain — called the "visual word form area" (VWFA) — is connected to the language network of the brain.

"That makes it fertile ground to develop a sensitivity to visual words — even before any exposure to language," said Zeynep Saygin, senior author of the study and assistant professor of psychology at The Ohio State University.

The VWFA is specialized for reading only in literate individuals. Some researchers had hy-

pothesized that the pre-reading VWFA starts out being no different than other parts of the visual cortex that are sensitive to seeing faces, scenes or other objects, and only becomes selective to words and letters as children learn to read or at least as they learn language.

"We found that isn't true. Even at birth, the VWFA is more connected functionally to the language network of the brain than it is to other areas," Saygin said. "It is an incredibly exciting finding."

Saygin, who is a core faculty member of Ohio State's Chronic Brain Injury Program, conducted the study with graduate students Jie Li and Heather Hansen and assistant professor David Osherson at Ohio State. Their results

were published today in the journal *Scientific Reports*. The researchers analyzed fMRI scans of the brains of 40 newborns, all less than a week old, who were part of the Developing Human Connectome Project.

They compared those to similar scans from 40 adults who participated in the separate Human Connectome Project. The VWFA is next in another part of visual cortex that processes faces, and it was reasonable to believe that there wasn't any difference in these parts of the brain in newborns, Saygin said.

As visual objects, faces have some of the same properties as words do, such as needing high spatial resolution for humans to see them correctly. But the researchers

found that, even in newborns, the VWFA was different from the part of the visual cortex that recognizes faces, primarily because of its functional connection to the language processing part of the brain.

"The VWFA is specialized to see words even before we're exposed to them," Saygin said. "It's interesting to think about how and why our brains develop functional modules that are sensitive to specific things like faces, objects, and words," said Li, who is lead author of the study.

"Our study really emphasized the role of already having brain connections at birth to help develop functional specialization, even for an experience-dependent category like reading,"

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Scientists map structure of potent antibody against coronavirus

Scientists at Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle have shown that a potent antibody from a COVID-19 survivor interferes with a key feature on the surface of the coronavirus's distinctive spikes and induces critical pieces of those spikes to break off in the process.

The antibody — a Y-shaped protein that is one of the body's premier weapons against pathogens including viruses — was isolated by the Fred Hutchinson team from a blood sample received from a Washington man patient in the early days of the pandemic.

The team led by Drs. Lee Brinkman and Andrea McClure and Marie Plummer previously reported that, among dozens of different antibodies generated naturally by human cells,

the patient, this one — dubbed CV30 — was 530 times more potent than any of its competitors.

Using state-of-the-art structural biology techniques, Plummer and her postdoctoral fellow Dr. Nicholas Hubbut have now mapped the molecular structure of CV30. They and their colleagues published their results online today in the journal Nature Communications.

The product of their research is a set of computer-generated 3D images that look to the untrained eye to be usually innocuous molecules. But to scientists, they show the precise shapes of proteins comprising critical surface structures of the coronavirus spike and the spike's binding site associated naturally by human cells.

PETITION

Petitioner, through counsel and in this Honorable Court, most respectfully alleges that:

NATURE OF THE ACTION

1. This is an action for declaration of nullity of marriage between petitioner Erna Dellos Reyes Vibas and respondent Marcos G. Fernandez as well and void on the following grounds:

- a. The absence of any of the essential or formal requisites of marriage under Article 4 of the Family Code shall render the marriage void ab initio;
- b. Those solemnized without a license under Article 10 of the Family Code; and
- c. Those registered as polygamous marriages under Article 11(4) of the Family Code.

PARTIES

2. Petitioner is a Filipino, of legal age, and a resident of BR. 2 Lot 13 Local Family Homes, Area 1-A, Iloilo City, Cebu, for more than six (6) months prior to the filing of this

petition and where she may be served with legal process of this Honorable Court.

3. Pursuant to A.A. No. 02-11-10-SC the Rule on Declaration of Absolute Nullity of Void Marriages and Annulment of Voidable Marriages, Petitioner avers the following allegations:

- a. Sworn certification of singleness (with license history sheets) issued by the bureaus;
- b. Sworn statement of marital record that he generally verified petitioner's singleness;
- c. Utility bills in the name of the petitioner for at least six (6) months prior to the filing of this petition; and
- d. Transfer Certificate of Title No. T-155493 registered in the name of the petitioner;

4. Respondent Marcos G. Fernandez, is of legal age, Filipino and a resident of 284 1032 Calle Kin, Tugueaon III, Iloilo City 6101 Japan where he may be served with summons and other legal process.

5. In the absence of a marriage solemnized, absolutely contrary to the provisions of the parties' property relations. The parties, however, have not contributed to or acquired any property during their marriage.

FACTUAL ANTECEDENTS / CAUSE OF ACTION

6. Sometime in 1991, Petitioner and one Scorgio C. Basista III (herein referred to as Basista) were both minors at a very young age, eighteen (18) and seventeen (17) years of age, respectively.

7. On February 14, 1991, they attended a wedding of their common friend wherein they acted as witnesses.

8. Thereafter and on the same day, they were encouraged by their friend who got married on that day, to also enter into what they called a "Secret Marriage".

9. Thus, Petitioner and Scorgio C. Basista III entered into marriage on February 14, 1991 in a wedding in Manila solemnized by Reverend Angel B. Naroido.

10. As indicated in the marriage certificate, the age of Basista at the time of his marriage with petitioner was twenty (20) years and date of birth as December 20, 1970, although in truth and in fact, he was only seventeen (17) years and one (1) month and twenty-five (25) days having been born on December 26, 1973, as proven by his Certificate of Live Birth issued by the Philippine Statistics Authority;

11. After the said "Secret Marriage", petitioner and Basista continued to live their own lives with their respective family and pursued their goals separately;

12. Few months after their "secret marriage" on February 14, 1991, Petitioner left for Japan to find a job;

13. In Japan petitioner met respondent Marcos G. Fernandez who courted her and they became sweethearts and with whom she had pre-marital sex;

14. When Petitioner discovered that she was pregnant with respondent, she further returned to the Philippines, sometime in the last quarter of 1991, with the intention to give birth to their child in the Philippines having learned respondent Fernandez is Japan;

15. Petitioner gave birth to Respondent Marc Fernandez, but

has been child, on May 18, 1994. From that time on, petitioner and respondent Fernandez never had communication with each other and their relationship ceased to exist as the former has not seen him anymore and the last information she had is that he had already married another woman;

16. Thereafter, sometime in the year 2014, Petitioner was preparing for her application for being an immigrant in the United States of America hence she had to secure necessary papers for the purpose;

17. Upon receiving from the PSA Certification about her status, she surprisingly discovered that her marriage with Basista and respondent Marcos G. Fernandez were registered;

18. Petitioner advised that her marriage with respondent Marcos G. Fernandez, he declared void and void from the beginning pursuant to the provisions of the Family Code of the Philippines;

ARGUMENTS

19. Articles 3 and 4 of the Family Code of the Philippines provide:

"Art. 3. The formal requisites of marriage are:
1) etc.;

2) A valid marriage license except in the case provided for in chapter 2 of this Title;

3) A marriage ceremony which takes place with the appearance of the contracting parties before the solemnizing officer and their personal declaration that they take each other as husband and wife in the presence of not less than two witnesses of legal age."

"Art. 4. The absence of any of the essential or formal requisites shall render the marriage void ab initio, except as stated in Article 15(2)."

20. The registered second marriage of Petitioner and Respondent Marcos G. Fernandez, appearing in their PSA Marriage Certificate, states that it was performed in Quezon City before a Veterans Apostolic Church Pastor in 907 Pambato Bldg. Quezon Hi-way, Norvaldez, Quezon City on March 21, 1994. **That marriage is a sham.** There was no real consent nor appearance of the parties on said date. Respondent Marcos G. Fernandez, at the time was in Japan. The parties never appeared before any government agency for the application of marriage license nor at the solemnization ceremony before any solemnizing officer. Thus, under Articles 3 and 4 of the Family Code of the Philippines, age is null and void from the beginning.

21. Moreover, Articles 40 and 41(4) of the Family Code of the Philippines provide:

"Art. 40. The absolute nullity of a previous marriage may be invoked for purposes of contracting on the basis solely of a final judgment declaring such previous marriage void."

"Art. 41. The following marriages shall be void from the beginning:

- 1) etc.;
- 2) etc.
- 3) etc.

4. These Allegations of polygamy marriages are falling under Article 33.)
XXXX

22. It is clear that at the time the first marriage, between petitioner and respondent were registered in the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), the first marriage of Petitioner with Respondent on February 14, 1991, though valid and valid under Article 33 (1) of the Family Code because of necessity, has not yet been judicially declared void on the basis of a final judgment by any competent Court.

23. Thus, the marriage between petitioner and respondent is a bigamous marriage, under Article 33 (1) of the Family Code, since the first marriage between petitioner and Respondent C. Spaulde III was still subsisting at the time the second marriage was registered to the records.

24. Petitioner prays to nullify the said second marriage between her and the respondent. Hence, this petition.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, petitioner prays that she be, respectively, granted the Honorable Court that the petition be granted declaring null and void the marriage entered into by and between petitioner Edna Reyes Viray and respondent Marcos G. Fernandez pursuant to Articles 1, 4 and 24(b) of the Family Code of the Philippines, as amended.

Other remedies and reliefs are likewise prayed for in the Honorable Court.

Cancer treatment without side effects?

Treating cancer side effects usually without debilitating caused by cranial irradiation. Their findings have been the holy grail of oncologists, and researchers at the University of California, Irvine and Switzerland's Lausanne University Hospital may have found it.

Charles Limoli, professor of radiation oncology at UCI, and Marie-Catherine Vignani, associate professor of radiation oncology at the Swiss facility, used an ultra-high dose rate of radiation therapy to eliminate brain tumors in mice, bypassing key

of the toxicities that normally plague cancer survivors long after radiation treatments, significantly decreasing side effects such as inflammation and impairments in cognition.

"It's not unreasonable to expect that in 10 years, this may become a widespread option for radiotherapy patients worldwide," Limoli said.

Traditional radiation therapy exposes a tumor and nearby normal tissue to radiation for several minutes at a time, but Flash radiation therapy (Flash-RT) allows delivery of the same dose in only tens of seconds. The speed eliminates many of the toxicities that normally plague cancer survivors long after radiation treatments, significantly decreasing side effects such as inflammation and impairments in cognition.

Drug resistance linked to antibiotic use and patient transfers in hospitals

Understanding the local level. The role of antibiotic use patterns and patient transfers in the emergence of drug-resistant microbes is essential to crafting effective prevention strategies, suggests a study published October 27, 2020 in eLife.

Antimicrobial resistance is a growing global health threat, but preventing it takes smart choices at the hospital or ward.

The authors, including lead author Julie Shapiro, Postdoctoral Fellow at the CIRI, Centre International de Recherches en Infectiologie, University of Lyon, France, explain that frequent antibiotic use in fragile patients and the potential for highly resistant pathogens to spread through hospital wards when patients are transferred, drive the emergence of resistance, and suggest a new approach for tailoring prevention strategies to an individual hospital or ward.

"Hospitals continue to be important hotspots for antimicrobial resistance because of the combination of frequent antibiotic use, fragile patients and the potential for highly resistant pathogens to spread through hospital wards when patients are transferred," explain lead author Julie Shapiro, Postdoctoral Fellow at the CIRI, Centre International de Recherches en Infectiologie, University of Lyon, France.
