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Humans co-evolved with immune-related diseases -- and it's still happening

Some of the same mutations allowing humans to fend off deadly infections also make us more prone to certain inflammatory and autoimmune diseases, such as Crohn's disease. In a Review published November 27 in the journal *Trends in Immunology*, researchers describe how ancestral origins impact the likelihood

that people of African or Eurasian descent might develop immune-related diseases. The authors also share evidence that the human immune system is still evolving depending on a person's location and lifestyle.

"In the past, people's lifespans were much shorter, so some of these inflammatory and autoimmune dis-

eases that can appear in the second half of life were not as relevant," says first author Jorge Dominguez-Andres (© dominique), a postdoctoral researcher at Radboud Institute for Molecular Life Science in the Netherlands. "Now that we live so much longer, we can see the consequences of infections that happened to

our ancestors."

One of the body's best defenses against infectious diseases is inflammation. Dominguez-Andres and senior author Mihai Netea, a Radboud University immunologist and evolutionary biologist, compiled data from genetics, immunology, microbiology, and virology.

genetic — over time — of new inflammatory diseases such as Crohn's disease, lupus, and inflammatory bowel disease. "There seems to be a balance. Humans evolve to build defenses against diseases, but we are not able to stop diseases from happening, so the benefit we obtain on one hand also makes us more sensitive to new

diseases on the other hand," says Dominguez-Andres. "Today, we are suffering or benefiting from defenses built into our DNA by our ancestors: immune systems fighting off infections or growing accustomed to new lifestyles." For example, the malaria parasite *Plasmodium sp.* has infected African populations for millions of years. In-

stead of this, evolutionary processes have selected people with DNA that favors resistance to infections by causing more inflammation in the body. In doing so, this has also contributed to making modern Africans prone to developing cardiovascular diseases, such as atherosclerosis, later in life.

Dominguez-Andres and Netzer also

write about how the early human ancestors of Eurasians lived in regions still inhabited by Neanderthals and modern DNA can be more resistant against HIV-1 and staph infections, but are also more likely to develop allergies, asthma, and hay fever.

The negative side effects of changes in each population's immune systems are a relatively recent finding. "We know a few things about what is happening at the genetic level in our ancestry, but we need more powerful technology. So, next generation sequencing is bursting now and allowing us to study the interplay between DNA and host responses at much deeper levels," says Dominguez-Andres. "So, we are obtaining a much more comprehensive point of view."

than urbanized African-Americans that eat store-bought foods. Also, changes in hygiene patterns seen in the last two centuries have improved sanitation, drinking water, and garbage collection, and have led to reduced exposure to infectious pathogens relative to previous times. As humans move toward processed foods and stricter hygiene standards, their bodies adapt by developing what researchers call "diseases of civilization," such as type 2 diabetes.

Moving forward, Dominguez-Andres and Netzer will expand their research to communities that fall outside African and Eurasian populations. "So far, all of the studies we went through are focused on populations with European and African descent, but they must also be extended to indigenous and other populations to improve the representation of human genetic diversity," says Dominguez-Andres. "Lifestyles and ecological factors can really differ and influence immune bacterial gut diversity responses."

played a major role, up the correct brain along with her mentor, networks to process Carin Shatz of Stanford University, in showing that spontaneous electrical activity in the eye during development — so-called retinal waves — is critical for setting

"We thought they of UC Berkeley's Helen Wills Neuroscience Institute. "We thought that the ganglion cells were there in the developing eye, that they are connected to the brain, but that they were not really connected to

much of the rest of the retina, at that point. Now, it turns out they are connected to each other, which was a surprising thing."

UC Berkeley graduate student Franklin Caval-Holme combined two-photon calcium imaging, whole-cell electrical recording, pharmacology and anatomical techniques to show that the six types of ipRGCs in the newborn mouse retina are electrically coupled, forming a retinal network that the researchers found not only detects light intensity of the light, which can vary nearly a billionfold. Gap junction circuits were critical for light sensitivity in some ipRGC subtypes, but not others, providing a potential avenue to determine which ipRGC subtypes provide the signal for specific non-visual behaviors that light evokes.

"Aversion to light, which pups develop very early, is intensity-dependent," suggesting that these neural circuits could be involved in light-aversion behavior, Caval-Holme said. "We don't know which of these ipRGC subtypes in the newborn retina actually contribute to the behavior, so it will be very interesting to see what role all these different subtypes have." The researchers also found evidence that the circuit tunes itself in a way that could adapt to the intensity of light, which probably has an important role in development, Feller said. "In the past, people demonstrated that these light-sensitive cells are important for things like the development of the blood vessels in the retina and light entrainment of circadian rhythms, but those were kind of a light on/light off response, where you need some light or no light," she said. "This seems to argue that they are actually trying to code for many different intensities of light, encoding much more information than people had previously thought."

occurs in people with diabetes when blood vessels in the eye leak their fluids into the portion of the retina that controls detailed vision.

Current therapies for this disease block the protein VEGF, which contributes to abnormal blood vessel growth. However, because the treatment is not adequate for more than half of patients with diabetic macular edema, investigators have long suspected that more factors drove vision loss in these patients.

In the new study, the Johns Hopkins researchers say they found compelling evidence that angiotensin-like 4 also plays in macular edema. The signaling protein is already well known to be a blood vessel growth factor with roles in heart disease, cancer and metabolic diseases, of which diabetes is one.

A report on the findings was published Sept. 23 in *The Journal of Clinical Investigation*.

Alon Sodhi, M.D., Ph.D., associate professor of ophthalmology at the Johns Hopkins University School of

Medicine and the Johns Hopkins Wilmer Eye Institute, in collaboration with Silvia Montanari, Ph.D., M.E.H., at the University of Maryland,

led the research team and was intrigued by angiopoietin-like 4 after finding, in previous studies, elevated levels of this protein in the eyes of people with a variety of vision-related diseases.

In the new study, Sodhi and his team found that angiopoietin-like 4 acts both independently and synergistically with VEGF activity, and they identified a potential way to block it.

The investigators made their discovery by exposing human blood vessel tissue cells grown in the lab to low levels of VEGF and angiopoietin-like 4. Knowing that low levels of these factors individually did not generally create an effect, the researchers were surprised to find that in combination, low-level VEGF and low-level angiopoietin-like 4 had a synergistic effect on vascular cell permeability, and identified the leakage

 "This told us that you can have subthresh-

current anti-VEGF therapies," says Sodhi.

To test this, the team looked to see whether the angiopoietin-like 4 protein bound to one of VEGF's receptors in lab-grown human vascular cells. They found that angiopoietin-like 4 did not bind to the classic VEGF receptor that is a target of current anti-VEGF medicines, but another less studied one called neuropilin.

With the newly identified receptor, the researchers next sought to learn whether a lab-grown version of the receptor could block angiopoietin-like 4 before it was able to interact with blood vessel cells.

To do that, they injected a soluble fragment of the neuropilin receptor into the eyes of mice pharmacologically treated to mimic human diabetes, resulting in a twofold increase in retinal vascular leakage. The treated diabetic mice showed approximately half of the blood vessel leakage as mice who did not receive the treatment, similar to the nondiabetic mice.

To further explore the new receptor-based treatment's potential value for human patients, the researchers grew human blood vessel cells in the lab in fluid samples collected from the eyes of patients with diabetic macular edema. To replicate the conditions and growth factors found naturally inside of the patients' eyes, one group of such cells was exposed to the soluble receptor neuropilin. The researchers say they observed a marked decrease in the diabetic macular edema cells treated with the receptor compared to untreated cells.

"This gives us some confidence that this approach will work in human eyes as well," says Sodhi, although he cautions that clinical use of a treatment based on their findings will require many more years of research.

Next, the researchers hope to take a look at the molecular interactions between angiopoietin-like 4 and the neuropilin receptor. Doing so, says Sodhi, will allow them to create a refined match that can bind up as much disease-threatening

blood serum pooled from multiple donors. Biomedical suppliers get their blood from blood banks, who pass along inventory that's mixing its composition date.

C H E E T I N G S :

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2010, petitioner JANICE A. DELA CRUZ-TANGAL, through counsel, filed a petition against EDWIN T. TANGAL, for Declaration of Nullity of Marriage, which read as follows:

P E T I T I O N

DOES NOW petitioner JANICE A. DELA CRUZ-TANGAL, through the undersigned counsel, and asks the Honorable Court, most respectfully states:

T H E P A R T I E S

1. Petitioner JANICE A. DELA CRUZ-TANGAL, is of legal age, Filipino and a resident of 876 Compadre St., Maasin 1, Ramon, Cavite. A photocopy of the Certificate issued by the Office of the Registrar is herewith attached and marked as Annex "A" and made an integral part thereof. For purposes of due Process, she may be served with summons, notices and other processions of the Honorable Court through the undersigned, counsel at Calt 304 CML, Maasin, 3981 Hinasar St., Pateros, Manila City.

2. Respondent EDWIN T. TANGAL, is likewise of legal age, Filipino and a resident of 4221 Heritage Park Parkway, Villasis, Pangasinan, where he may be served with summons and other court processions.

A L L E G A T I O N S P R E F A T O R Y T O T H E F A C T S A N D C A U S E O F A C T I O N

3. Petitioner and respondent are husband and wife, having been joined in marriage on 23 April 2003 in Malabon City. A photocopy of the parties' marriage certificate is herewith attached and marked as Annex "B" and made an integral part hereof.

4. The events here a true marital Eljak Dewarin (aka Cruz Tangal), who was born on 31 July 2000. A photocopy of his birth certificate is herewith attached and marked as Annex "C" and made an integral part hereof.

5. The parties have been separated in that since 2010.

6. All efforts towards reconciliation have ceased by the parties but to no avail.

7. Petitioner and respondent did not consider any property, hold and not personal, during their marriage.

8. This is a verified petition for the declaration of nullity of marriage pursuant to Article 18 of the Family Code of the Philippines which provides as follows:

"A marriage contracted by any party who, at the time of the celebration was psychologically incapacitated to comply with the essential marital obligations of marriage, shall likewise be null and void in case it becomes manifest early after its celebration."

9. Likewise, Article 39 of the same code is provided, to wit:

"The husband and wife are obliged to live together, observe mutual love, respect and fidelity, and render mutual help and support."

10. Obedient to petitioner, letters her marriage is the respondent, the latter had been psychologically incapacitated to observe a certain marital obligation and cannot be satisfied, during the marriage, such degree of emotional incapacity, behavioral control and irresponsibility attitude as severely deteriorated his responsibility to discharge marital obligations.

T H E F A C T S A N D C A U S E O F A C T I O N

11. Petitioner first came acquainted with respondent in 1995 when they became acquainted during their first year High school. However, their marital union which he was transferred to another school during their senior year. He did never because close to each other, the early stage was:

12. Their path crossed again when, during their college years, he suddenly called her and invited her to be his partner in an actual traditional graduation ball. She did not like her partner, but answered to him, responded was in constant contact with her mother who was pushing her to be his girlfriend. Thus, her mother tried to convince her to accept his request. Her mother then forced her to be respondent's high school partner. As she could not do anything, she gave in to her mother's order against her will.

13. Before they left their house on the night of the graduation ball, her mother accompanied her to answer the love being offered by the respondent. She was puzzled as he was not really courting her.

14. At the graduation ball, respondent, in the presence of his friends, asked her if they're already in a relationship, reminding her that her mother likes him. She was left with no choice but to say yes to him. After a while she had a second thought and realized that she did not like him. Thus, before midnight, she broke up with him.

15. After the graduation ball, he accompanied her home with her's heart. Her mother, who was eagerly waiting for her, was very interested in what transpired that night. However, her mother was disgusted upon learning that two hours after accepting respondent's love, she broke up with him. She was surprised when her mother told her angrily, "Dewarin was, suggest me why. Peter Eljak and Adhonyan was suggested why before you graduated now?" When she answered that she does not love him, her mother replied, "Mananahang mo akong magulang."

16. Thereafter, her mother started nagging her, telling her that she will never allow anybody else to court her as she should be the one to choose who's good for her. The next day her mother called respondent and told her that they were again in a relationship. Thus, she was forced to talk to him over the phone.

17. Thereafter, he became a regular visitor to their house and he started sleeping with them. After sometime her mother whom she likes to sleep with her. Even they already had sex she could not really accept him and could even stomach to love him.

18. In year 2003, the respondent had engineering degree and

immediately worked while respondent also started to work in another company.

19. After the events, her mother constantly reproaches her for this about their relationship. An unexpected development came later on, petitioner's mother told her to start to work. During "Date of no Love it." He was forced to bring her parents to their and planned their wedding.

20. They got married on April 23, 2003 at the Iglesia ni Cristo. After the wedding, the couple lived with petitioner's family. It was her that he continued to see that he and her mother never set and planned everything to see her. She felt being deceived and trapped by them.

21. During their married life, petitioner observed that respondent was very possessive. He also got extremely jealous of her male friends, including a common friend of them who at one point he had up. During one of his possessive, he pushed her down a flight of stairs, injuring her.

22. When she got pregnant, she was not included in what she got ready to become a mother.

23. There was a time that she and her mother were discussing about the property bought by her mother in Pateros, which her mother was asking her to pay for. When respondent arrived he overheard the discussion and he suddenly burst out for anger. He grabbed the phone on the table and dialed 2 on the line. The first number at 1st level and her mother, asking them not to interfere with their family affair and not to talk about their body. She and her mother got scared as he was very violent. The event that to explain that they're not talking if about his family but he stated that they were talking badly about him and his family.

24. They often quarrel because of his suspicion every on 11th things that did from the way she dress-up like she would around friends. Some fights involved verbal attacks and emotional abuse but there were times that he would get physical. And he often's case whether there were people around even her parents. He would call her "Stomping," "Pek-pek," "Maland," "Tanga," and other harmful names even in the presence of his relatives.

25. If a woman just remembers she had to deal with, respondent was unfaithful, but she felt even in front of her. Although she didn't love him, she was angry because she felt being discriminated and when she confronted him about it, he pushed her on the stairs again.

26. On April 23, 2008, she gave birth to their son and named him Eljak Dewarin. She thought that he started to see her son but still mother and even same her point in believing that she does not love her son.

27. As respondent was busy with his work and their schedules were different, they did not see each other regularly.

28. As petitioner felt that she was just waiting her time with him and her son, she decided to apply the work abroad. She also felt that her mother was telling her lies and obstructing her happiness. Her maternal grand who was then working in Dubai, United Arab had a job in Dubai. Thus, few months after giving birth, she flew to Dubai to work as office receptionist. It was there that she felt freedom and happiness. The nearest nearest respondent and their son, who was under the care of her mother.

29. Even when she was already working in Dubai, his behavior and attitude gradually did not stop. He kept on harassing her of cheating and tried to catch her in the act through her office numbers by sending them messages on several months. She could further be kept on nagging her. Looking at her picture thru her friends' FB account and seeing messs from her way she wanted and the people she was with. She kept on demanding her to call him on his every weekend. At last, she called him but after sometime she started manufacturing reasons not to avoid him.

30. During her last vacation, she stated that he was sending her like this message that her name said him that she was living like a single woman in Dubai, regularly going out with her friends and seemed not missing her family. When he confirmed her, she denied the status of her son. She then back to Dubai and resumed her freedom, both at work and personally. He then started to stalk her and to talk with her and her friends, even during office hours, about her business stability.

31. There was even an instance when he sent her employer an email message saying that she's a cheater, a cheap girl, and an irresponsible mother and a wife. He demanded that her employment should be terminated, her employer called her sometimes and let her read the email that respondent had sent her. Her employer then told her that he was not of her personal file but he advised her to continue to work hard.

32. He continued to bully her on social media thru her friends in Dubai. There was even a time that one of her friends told her to ask him to stop calling her or sending messages as he was already harassing her work.

33. In 2009, she went home for a vacation. At the airport, her mother wanted her that respondent was very angry at her. She was also told that he would stay her and embarrass her soon at her airport. That evening, when he approached her, he pulled her hand on her arm and whispered to her that she was a "Pisagol". She just ignored him as she did not want to make a scene at the airport.

34. When they arrived home, he immediately opened her hand carry luggage and checked her personal belongings. He also searched her mobile phone and saw nothing but her pictures, but he kept on searching her of delicately. They did not sleep together that night.

35. One night, she was awakened by the respondent to talk to her that he had proof of her delinquency. As she ignored him, he finally pulled her out of the bed and dragged her down stairs. She saw a chair from their common friend but there was no attention in what he was saying.

36. After five days, he gave opened her bag and took her passport containing her working visa and brought it down stairs and showed her how to use it on prison. She was shocked and was shaking because of anger. He then started to hurt her physically every in front of their son. She then realized and also tried to hurt him but he was much stronger than her. When her relatives heard the commotion, her relatives went to them and intervened.

37. She presumably applied for another passport and visa. In the meantime, she possessed her trip back to Dubai. From that on she refused to talk with him. Respondent left their house. However, before her flight back to Dubai, he came back and wanted to talk with her. When she refused to talk with him, he told her that he would make sure that she would be happy for the rest of her life. He left their house, bringing their son with him.

38. Since then neither saw her son. She then decided not to come to their house whenever she was on vacation.

39. The foregoing acts of respondent indicate that he failed to provide the petitioner and their children with the companionship, respect, material help, support and care required by law.

40. Not only had the respondent breached their marital obligations, but his unstable and irrational disposition, his selfish and irresponsible, even as shown above, unequivocally demonstrates that respondent did not have the proper outlook and disposition or temperament necessary for his marriage with the petitioner.

41. More importantly, in subjecting the petitioner to physical, verbal and emotional abuse, the respondent brings serious danger and caused suffering to the petitioner, thus, making

her to live under stress and under abnormal circumstances.

42. The consultation of the respondent's psychological materials, which decreased from time especially, point to the grossly and immaturity of his psychological condition. His condition is characterized by judicial abandonment, as it already existed even before they got marriage.

43. The failure and/or inability of the petitioner to perform the essential marital obligations as shown in the foregoing paragraphs currently causes the marriage between them null and void on the ground of his psychological incapacity under the provision of Article 36 of the Family Code.

44. To advise the petitioner from the verbal of a marriage which had brought her nothing but pain and grief, petitioner was constrained to ask the ultimate instance of filing a petition for declaration of nullity of their marriage.

45. Petitioner engaged a clinical psychologist who conducted psychological evaluation on both the petitioner and the respondent to determine whether or not both parties were fully able to comply with the essential marital obligations as enunciated with Article 68 of the Family Code of the Philippines.

46. After thorough assessment and number of procedures, Dr. Laidlan T. Cruz conducted the Psychological Evaluation Report including petitioner Janna A. Dela Cruz-Togal to be suffering from Narcissistic Personality Disorder and respondent Eliohe T. Togal, from Paranoid Personality Disorder. A glossary of the Psychological Evaluation Report is herein attached and marked as Annex "D" and mark as original per Annex E.

47. In the Psychological Evaluation Report, the Psychologist declared that Respondent manifested the following behavior indicators of a Paranoid Personality Disorder (PPD):

a. The core symptom of respondent's personality disorder is a generalized distrust of other people, especially of family.

b. Respondent with a narcissistic personality disorder, is unable to acknowledge his own negative feelings toward others but does not generally live with with envy.

c. Respondent's thinking and behavior associated with his Paranoid Personality Disorder affect his capacity and facility to maintain relationships, as well as his ability to function socially and in work situations.

d. Respondent with this disorder always assumes that others are out to manipulate, harm, exploit, or deceive him, even when no evidence exists that supports his assumption.

e. Persons with paranoid personality disorder like respondent are commonly difficult to get along with and have problems with other relationships.

f. Since respondent persistently questions the motivations and trustworthiness of petitioner, he with this disorder is not inclined to share intimacies. As a result, he becomes suspicious, resentful and unfriendly, argumentative and vindictive.

g. Being a paranoid personality, respondent lacks trust in the petitioner and he has an extreme need to be self-sufficient and a strong sense of autonomy.

h. His being Paranoid causes respondent to exhibit a pervasive pattern of unjust thoughts, feelings, and cerebral behaviors that fall well outside societal norms.

48. According to the Report, Respondent's Paranoid Personality Disorder symptoms include:

w. Doubt the competence, loyalty, or trustworthiness of others, believing others are trying to deceive him.

x. In relation to credible or reliable or factual personal information due to a fear that the information will be used against him.

y. Accusations and false charges.

z. An hypersensitive and acute criticism poorly.

aa. Read hidden meanings to the innocent remarks or casual looks of others.

ab. Perceive attacks on their character that are not apparent to others. They generally react with anger and are quick to retaliate.

ac. Have recurrent suspicions, without cause, that their spouse or lover are being unfaithful.

ad. Are generally cold and distant in relationships with others, and covering and jealous.

ae. Cause no difficulties in conflicts or conflicts, believing he's always right.

af. Are hostile, jealous, and argumentative.

49. The Root Cause of respondent's Paranoid Personality Disorder (PPD) can be traced back from his childhood environment, upbringing, and experiences which developed when this type of environment and thinking became part of his personality or selfhood experiences.

50. On the other hand, the Psychologist declared in the same Report that petitioner manifested the following behavior indicators of a Narcissistic Personality Disorder (NPD):

a. The lack of empathy and his exaggerated sense of self-importance that makes her from respecting limits.

b. As she lacks empathy and concern for others she became a manipulator.

c. The petitioner is that the only person whose needs about to meet herself. She doesn't care what other people need or how they feel.

d. The trouble in having things between her as the response of others.

e. She has errors in thinking that prevent her from seeing things how they are from both sides of the picture.

f. As a Narcissistic, she is selfish and her selfishness is one of the major reasons of their marital relationship. She just gives attention and emphasis on her body, looks, charm and she uses everything around her to obtain her narcissistic supply.

g. She also has feeling of superior when she gets her way or when others feel bad.

h. She cannot handle criticism in any way and feels that she's being made wrong.

i. She usually gives others treatment or hold grudges.

j. Failure in her relationship is the result of her lack of insight about understanding and processing of feelings.

k. This jealousy and a loving partnership require the skills of dealing with conflict. As she has the narcissistic personality disorder she often discovers the source in the relationship and pull away from her partner.

51. Hence, the Psychological Evaluation Report shows petitioner's Pattern of Narcissistic behavior. It was

4. We trust people with respect for them, we naturally believe they are worthy of it. There is no doubt Janice trusts them close to her with discretion. She only acts respectfully towards strangers and outsiders as a way of maintaining her image.

5. We give love and attention to others because we know that's why we are here and because we enjoy it. Janice only makes love and attention but never gives it away. That's all she knows since she functions only from ego.

6. When conflict arises, we are able to let it go and move on. She is a narcissist, never get revenge.

7. We trust in the good of all people. Janice believes everyone is just like her.

8. We like to help people but good about themselves and feel relief when a conflict has been resolved. She likes to fight.

9. We take responsibility when we've made a mistake. Narcissistic Janice blames everyone else.

12. The Root Cause of Person's Narcissistic Personality Disorder (NPD) can be traced from her childhood and upbringing. The development of her disorder learned in model the world of her early life experiences. How her parents raised and treated her, was how she learned to operate the treatment of her from the rest of people in her surroundings. Her early life interactions were negative, and were based off unstable, words, abuse or neglectful. Her young brain learned to see the world and all of the people in it.

13. The personality disorders of the petitioner and the respondent are both narcissistic, grave, and permanent, since they were acquired and had progressed during their childhood and early adolescence. The psychologist discussed the incurability and gravity of the parties' psychological incapacity in this way:

"Janice and Edwin's psychological disorders are amenable because personality disorder is by definition enduring, permanent and reflects the pattern of behavior and inner experience (Pope & Bruce, 2003). In addition, Janice and Edwin have rigid, egotistical personality traits (confident, Treatment could not work because they do not accept that they have these personality disorders. Personality disorders are often "ego-syntonic," which means that the person having the disturbance thinks their's nothing wrong with them and that everyone else has the problem. For another, traditional psychotherapeutic and counseling approaches are not very effective. It takes more than a few visits, and a very different kind of counseling to help affect change in someone who instead has a personality disturbance. In fact, there is no known cure for her personality disorder yet."

14. In addition, Personality Disorders are described in the International Classification of Mental and Behavioral Disorders (ICD-10) as deeply ingrained and enduring behavior patterns, manifesting themselves as inflexible responses in a broad range of personal and social situations; they represent either extreme or significant deviations from the way her average individual in a given culture perceives, thinks, feels, and particularly relates to others and are developmental conditions, which appear in childhood or adolescence and continue into adulthood (World Health Organization, 1982a). xxx"

In this context, in the opinion of the marriage Janice and Edwin are psychologically incapacitated to perform the duties and responsibilities of marriage. Her psychological incapacity is amenable, enduring, and permanent based on their personality structure. Janice is evaluated to be having Narcissistic Personality Disorder while Edwin is assessed to be having Paranoid Personality Disorder. Janice

and Edwin are psychologically incapacitated at the time the marriage was celebrated.

Janice and Edwin's disorders are grave enough to bring about the disability to observe the essential obligations of marriage. Her psychological disorders show absolute incapacity or inability. In other words, there are fixed and unchanging disabling factors in them, as shown in our expert witness in their personal testimony that effectively incapacitates Janice and Edwin from really accepting and thereby complying with the obligations essential to marriage. They do not function rationally, respect and render mutual help and support, they commit acts, which bring pain or injury to each other.

In this context, Janice and Edwin's psychological incapacitation are incurable, permanent, and permanent based on her personality structure. Janice and Edwin both having personality disorders. They are psychologically incapacitated at the time the marriage was celebrated."

15. The psychologist that recommended, as follows:

Since the doctor were not only shown by the result of the battery of tests but also numbers of procedures such as historical taking, clinical interviews, other sources of information, checking the levels of Janice and Edwin and other procedures, and since Janice and Edwin Tangal have personality disorders which are indicators of psychological incapacity to perform the essential marital obligations such as living together, observing mutual respect, and rendering mutual support, it is recommended that the marriage be declared null and void.

16. Petitioner must respectfully manifest that these act and activities of respondent are precisely the very said grounds mentioned under Article 36 of the Family Code of the Philippines that warrant and justify the dissolution of a marriage based on psychological incapacity, and Article 68 of the same law, that requires the spouses to live together, and observe accepted norms and standards to make go of a marital union.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, petitioner prays that judgment be rendered:

a. Declaring the marriage between petitioner and respondent null and void on the ground of psychological incapacity of respondent under the provision of Article 36 of the Family Code of the Philippines;

b. Ordering the Local Civil Registrar of Marikina City and the Civil Registrar General (Philippine Statistics Authority) to cancel from its respective Book of Marriage the entry on the marriage between the parties and to record the judgment declaring the absolute nullity of the marriage between said parties by reason of the respondent's psychological incapacity under Article 36 of the Family Code.

Petitioner further prays for such other relief just and equitable under the premises.

Building a better flu shot

Each year millions of Americans become sick with the flu, hundreds of thousands are hospitalized and tens of thousands die. Getting the flu shot can reduce the chances of infection. But, at best, the vaccine is only effective 40% to 60% of the time, according to the CDC.

Now Michigan State University researchers have data that show how cellular RNA levels change following infection or vaccination. Their work could help make future flu vaccines work better or even aid in the design of a universal vaccine.

"Understanding these differences could help us identify new targets for building better vaccines as well as help us figure out better ways to treat the disease," said George Maas, assistant professor of biochemistry and molecular bi-

ology and chief of the Systems Biology Division at the Institute for Quantitative Health Science and Engineering at MSU.

Maas and his co-authors reanalyzed data from 18 previously published studies where scientists had taken blood samples from flu patients and vaccine recipients and studied those samples for gene expression. Gene expression can be measured by looking for the levels of RNA in cells. When a gene is expressed in a cell it means the DNA has been used to produce RNA for this gene. The gene expression in cells can change in response to stimuli, including disease.

"The motivation for combining the different datasets is that typically the smaller datasets will be underpowered statistically to detect signif-

icant differences," Maas said. "By combining multiple studies, we're increasing our power and ability to detect gene expression differences between the variables that we're interested in."

The researchers found 978 genes with changed expression for flu infection and flu vaccination. Roughly a third of those genes, 334, overlapped while about two-thirds, 644, were unique to either flu infection or flu vaccination.

The distinct genes were involved in different processes in the body. Several genes that were expressed differently in flu infection, for example, are involved in the body's defensive mechanisms. On the flip side, genes exclusively expressed in vaccination were involved in antigen processing, which stimulates the body's immune response.

Cutting neurodegeneration associated with dementia, in animal models

The Korea Brain Research Institute (KBRI, President Park Geun-hye) announced on November 11 that Korean research team made up of Dr. Hyung-Jun Kim and Shinyeul Lee of KBRI, and professor Kyung-Kim of Seoulchanhyang University, found a new molecular mechanism of suppressing neuronal toxicity associated dementia and Lou Gehrig's disease.

These findings were published in the November issue of *Autophagy*. Neurons in patients with dementia or Lou Gehrig's disease often have abnormal aggregates that contain TDP-43 protein, and these accumulated aggregates can cause neurodegeneration by interrupting ubiquitin-proteasome system (UPS) that removes damaged or unnecessary proteins.

The research team found a new role of three proteins (PTIC2, TBK1, SQSTM1) which can inhibit neuronal degeneration by TDP-43 and demonstrated for the first time that their interaction can alleviate neurodegeneration by strengthening autophagy lysosome pathway (ALP), which consists of another protein quality control system in case of damage to the UPS.
