Training hub to boost fight vs. terrorism in PH

SILANG, Cavite – The government's fight against terrorism in the Philippines will be strengthened after the recent groundbreaking of the first-ever counter-terrorism training center in Southeast Asia here.

The PHP350-million, state-of-the-art Regional Counter-Terrorism Training Center (RCTTC) that would rise at Camp General Mariano A. Castañeda will be jointly operated by the United States (US) and Philippine governments.

The RCTTC, which forms part of the PHP520-million US investment, aims to train Filipino law enforcement personnel on counter-terrorism operations and further strengthen the region-

security relationship and cooperation between the Philippines and East Asia Pacific partners namely: Indonesia, Thailand, and Malaysia.

Humans have salamander-like ability to regrow cartilage in joints

Contrary to popular belief, cartilage in human joints can repair itself through a process similar to that used by creatures such as salamanders and zebrafish to regenerate limbs, researchers at Duke Health found.

Publishing online Oct. 9 in the journal *Science Advances*, the researchers identified a mechanism for cartilage repair that appears to be more robust in some joints and less so in

hips. The finding could potentially lead to treatments for osteoarthritis, the most common joint disorder in the world.

"We believe that an understanding of this salamander-like regenerative capacity in humans, and the critically missing components of this regulatory circuit, could provide the foundation for new approaches to repair joint tissues and possibly whole human limbs," said senior author Virginia Byers

Kraus, M.D., Ph.D., a professor in the departments of Medicine, Pathology and Orthopedic Surgery at Duke.

Kraus and colleagues, including lead author Ming-feng Huang, Ph.D., devised a way to determine the age of proteins using internal molecular clocks integral to amino acids, which convert one form to another with predictable regularity.

Newly created proteins in tissue have few

or no amino acid conversions; older proteins have many. Understanding this process enabled the researchers to use sensitive mass spectrometry to identify when key proteins in human cartilage, including collagens, were young, middle-aged or old.

They found that the age of cartilage largely depended on where it resided in the body. Cartilage in ankles is young, it's middle-aged in the knee and old in the hips.

Coffee bean extracts alleviate inflammation, insulin resistance in mouse cells

When coffee beans are processed and milled, the husk and silver-skin of the bean are removed and unused, and often are left behind in fields by coffee producers.

Food science and human nutrition researchers at the University of Illinois are interested in the potential of inflammation-fighting compounds found in the silver-skin and husk of coffee beans, not only for their benefits in alleviating chronic disease, but also in adding value to a would-be "waste" product from the coffee processing industry.

A recent study, published in Food and Chemical Toxicology, shows that when fat cells of mice were treated with water-based extracts from coffee beans, two phenolic compounds -- protocatechuic acid and gallic acid -- in particular reduced fat-induced inflammation in the cells and improved glucose absorption and insulin sensitivity.

Type 2 diabetes and obesity could be treated by new, less invasive procedure

New research from King's College London published in *EuroIntervention*, has found that a newly tested medical device, called Sleeveballoon, mimics the effects of traditional bariatric surgery in rodents and produces impressive results on body weight, fatty liver and diabetes control.

Sleeveballoon is a device that combines a balloon with a connected sleeve, which covers the initial parts of the small intestine. It is inserted into the stomach and bowel during minimally

general anesthetic. In this study, researchers compared the effects of the Sleeveballoon and traditional bariatric surgery on 30 rodents fed with a high-fat diet, achieving very similar results. Results were also compared to sham-operated rats, with the new device reducing food intake by 60% and resulting in a 57% reduction in fat mass. The effect on diabetes was similarly impressive with blood glucose levels dropping by 43%.

Chronobiology: Sleep and synaptic rhythms

mechanisms at the cellular level in the brain is not yet fully understood. Professor Maria Robles, head of a research group at the Institute of Medical Psychology at LMU Munich, shows in two recent articles published in the journal *Science* how sleep and wake cycles, rather than the circadian clock, drive cycles of protein abundance as well as phosphorylation in synaptic proteins in systematic dynamics of synaptic activity in the brain. One work shows that sleep-wake cycles play a central role in the temporal regulation of many aspects of synaptic functions," says Maria Robles. The LMU chronobiologist and her research group use mass spectrometry-based quantitative proteomics to profile daily dynamics of protein and phosphorylation in *in vivo* isolated synapses from mouse forebrain. For the studies in *Science*, the team investigated how synaptic proteins and phosphoproteome are dynamically shaped across the day and how it is affected by sleep deprivation.

Habitual tea drinking modulates brain efficiency: Evidence from brain connectivity evaluation

The researchers recruited healthy volunteer participants to two groups according to their history of tea drinking frequency and investigated both functional and structural networks to reveal the role of tea drinking on brain organization.

The suppression of hemispheric asymmetry in the structural connectivity network was observed as a result of tea drinking.

The authors did not

observe any significant effects of tea drinking on the hemispheric asymmetry of the functional connectivity network.

Dr Junfeng Li and Dr Lei Feng said, "Tea has been a popular beverage since antiquity, with records referring to consumption dating back to the dynasty of Shen Nong (approximately 2700 BC) in China. Tea is consumed in diverse ways, with brewed tea and prod-

ucts with a tea ingredient extremely prevalent in Asia, especially in China and Japan.

Although individual constituents of tea have been related to the roles of maintaining cognitive abilities and preventing cognitive decline, a study with behavioral and neurophysiological measures showed that there was a degraded effect or no effect when a constituent was administered alone and a significant effect

was observed only when constituents were combined.

The superior effect of the constituent combination was also demonstrated in a comparative experiment that suggested that tea itself should be administered instead of tea extracts; a review of tea effects on the prevention of Alzheimer's disease, found that the neuroprotective role of herbal tea was apparent in eight

out of nine studies.

It is worth noting that the majority of studies thus far have evaluated tea effects from the perspective of neurocognitive and neuropsychological measures, with direct measurement of brain structure or function less well represented in the extant literature.

These studies focusing on brain regional alterations did not ascertain tea effects on intraregional interactions

at the level of the entire brain.

The Li Feng Research team concluded, "In summary, our study comprehensively investigated the effects of tea drinking on brain connectivity at both global and regional scales using state-of-the-art imaging data and provided the first compelling evidence that tea drinking positively contributes to brain structure making network organization more efficient."

Powerful new genomics method can be used to reveal the causes of rare genetic diseases

A team led by a scientist at Scripps Research has invented a new genomics technique for tracking down the causes of rare genetic diseases.

The technique, which the researchers report in *Science*, makes use of the fact that people inherit two copies or "alleles" of virtually every gene, one

from the mother and one from the father. The new method compares activity levels of maternal and paternal alleles across the genome and detects when the activity of an allele lies far enough outside the normal range to be a plausible cause of disease.

The researchers demonstrated their technique by using it to

reveal disease-causing genes in patients with rare muscular dystrophies.

"Adding this method to our toolkit should allow us to detect the causes of rare genetic diseases for some of the cases in which standard methods fail," says study first author Pejman Mohammadi, PhD, an assistant professor in the

Department of Integrative Structural and Computational Biology at Scripps Research.

Mohammadi began working on the project as a postdoctoral research associate in the Lappalainen lab at the New York Genome Center and Columbia University. After joining Scripps Research in 2018, he continued the

research collaboratively with Lappalainen lab.

The team was focused on finding a better way to identify rare genetic diseases that emerge early in life and can be significantly debilitating or even life-threatening. Standard methods of sequencing genes and their transcripts — applied to the affected person and family

members — usually can reveal the cause, but only if the disease-causing gene mutations are obvious ones that result in missing or severely truncated proteins.

At least half of rare genetic diseases have more subtle causes that effectively can't be detected using standard methods, Mohammadi says.

New test diagnoses Lyme disease within 15 minutes

Some 300,000 people in the U.S. are diagnosed with Lyme disease every year. Caused by *Borrelia burgdorferi* and transmitted by the bite of infected Ixodes ticks, the disease if left untreated can cause serious neurologic, cardiac, and rheumatologic complications.

Current testing for Lyme disease, called the standard 2-tiered approach or the EIT2, involves running two complex assays (ELISA and western blot) to detect antibodies against the bacterium, and requires experimental personnel in a lab and a few hours to carry out and interpret. A team led by Sam Xia, professor of biomedical engineering at Columbia Engi-

neering, has developed a rapid microfluidic test that can detect Lyme disease with similar performance as the EIT2 in a much shorter time — 15 minutes.

"Our findings are the first to demonstrate that Lyme disease diagnosis can be carried out in a microfluidic format that can provide rapid quantitative results," says Xia, whose lab is focused on using microfluidics to build low-cost, low-powered devices for performing sophisticated medical tests, together with developing new treatment modalities based on cell therapy and nanoparticle devices. "This means that our test could easily be used directly in a doctor's office, obviating having to

send the samples out to a laboratory that needs at least a couple of hours, if not days, to get test results."

Xia's group worked in collaboration with Maria Gomez-Solbeck from Immuno Technologies, which found a combination of three proteins that identified antibodies specific to the *B. burgdorferi* bacterium in the serum, and COPEO Health, which provided microfluidic cassettes. Their findings were published October 11, 2019 in the *Journal of Clinical Microbiology*.

The researchers evaluated 142 samples, including patients with early Lyme disease, healthy individuals from areas where Lyme disease is endemic,

Brain protein promotes maintenance of chronic pain

A protein called RGS4 (Regulator of G protein signaling) plays a prominent role in the maintenance of long-term pain states and may serve as a promising new target for the treatment of chronic pain conditions, according to research conducted at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai and published in print October 16 in the *Journal of Neuroscience*.

The discovery may help doctors step away from progressing into chronic pain, a condition in which patients experience not just pain, but a number of debilitating symptoms ranging from sensory deficits to depression and loss of motivation. The transition from acute to chronic (pathological) pain is accompanied by numerous adaptations in immune, glial, and neuronal cells, many of

which are still not well understood. As a result, currently available medications for neuropathic or chronic inflammatory pain show limited efficacy and major side effects.

Commonly administered opioids provide temporary alleviation of acute pain symptoms, but carry serious risks like addiction in the context of long-term treatment for chronic pain.
